March 1, 2026

Primary Scripture: 1 Corinthians 6:13 to 20, Hebrews 13:4, Genesis 2:24

Key Point: Sex is sacred, powerful, and meant for covenant.

Application Point: Reassure your student that no failure puts them beyond God's grace. Jesus both forgives and heals. Pray together for purity of heart and freedom from shame.

Guided Questions:

- What makes this topic hard to talk about honestly with adults?
- How do shame or secrecy affect the way people experience relationships or faith?

March 8, 2026

Primary Scripture: 1 Corinthians 7:7 to 8, 32 to 35, Philippians 4:11 to 13

Key Point: Singleness is a calling not a curse.

Application Point: Affirm your student's worth and completeness in Christ. Help them name opportunities they have right now to grow, serve, and lead that might be harder later in life.

Guided Questions:

- Do you ever feel like life has not really started yet because of your relationship status?
- What do you think God might want to grow in you during this season of life?

March 15, 2026

Primary Scripture: Ephesians 5:21 to 33, Matthew 19:4 to 6

Key Point: Marriage is a covenant that reflects the gospel.

Application Point: Model what covenant faithfulness looks like through forgiveness, sacrifice, and commitment. Encourage that pursuit of Jesus is the best preparation for any relationship.

Guided Questions:

- What do you think makes a marriage last when feelings change?
- How does seeing marriage as a picture of Jesus change the way you think about dating?

March 29, 2026

Primary Scripture: Hosea 3:1 to 5, Colossians 3:12 to 14, 1 John 4:7 to 11

Key Point: God rebuilds what feels broken beyond repair.

Application Point: Bring areas of shame and hurt before God together. Emphasize restoration not condemnation, and remind them that God's grace writes better stories than failure ever could.

Guided Questions:

- Have you ever felt like a mistake defined you or limited your future?
- What does it mean to you that God stays when people fail or leave?
